Greetings, Friends,


As Pastor of this community of believers, I welcome you.

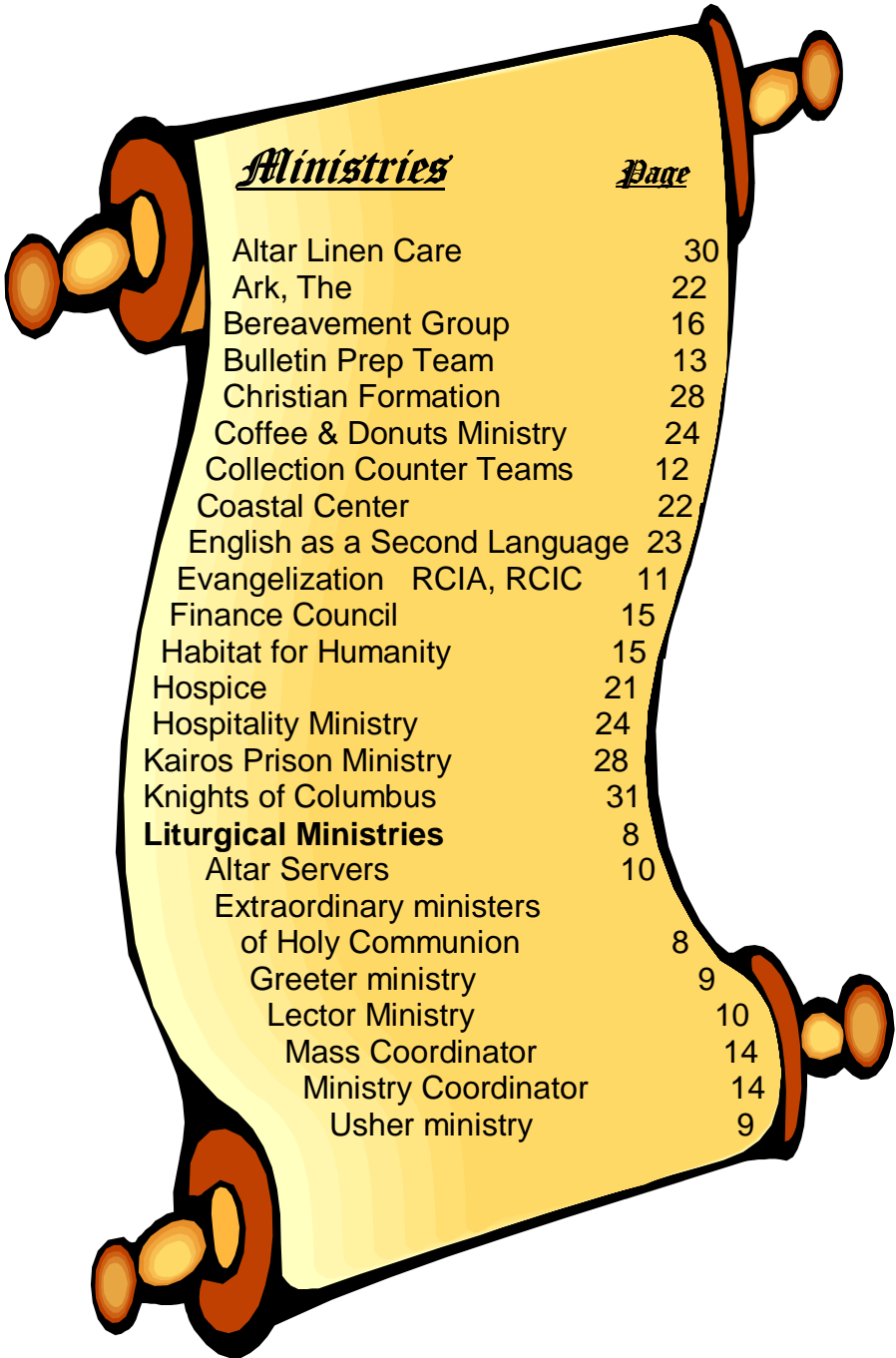

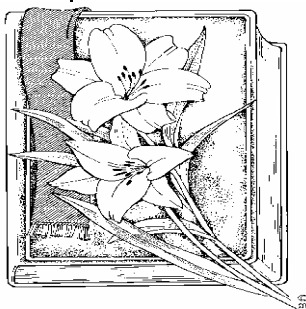

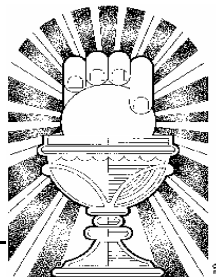

Liturgical Ministers

These are the people who assist in the celebration of Liturgy each week. There are five Liturgical Ministry teams (Team A through Team E). Each Mass team consists of a coordinator, Eucharistic ministers, lectors, ushers, greeters, and altar servers. Each team serves once every five weeks. Ministers are asked to commit to a certain Mass time, a certain team, and a particular ministry. Anyone interested in these ministries should contact the church office, 873-0631, Ext.21

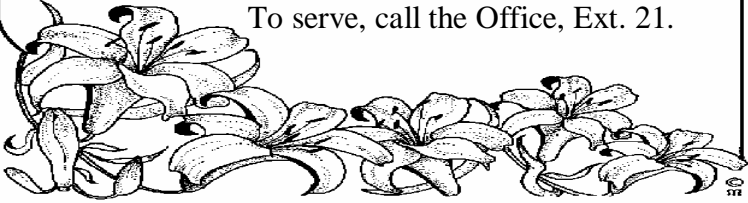
Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

These are the people who assist the Priest in distributing the Blessed Sacrament at communion. They also set up before Mass and clean up afterwards. One must be registered in the parish, be a confirmed Catholic and receive training for this ministry. The training takes about an hour and is scheduled throughout the year as needed. Greeters

As ministers of hospitality, greeters are the face of the parish. This is a ministry that anyone can perform, but one that must be performed in a spirit of love and caring. While handing out the worship aids before Mass and the bulletins at the end, these ministers demonstrate the welcoming attitude of our parish. They are a smiling face that says

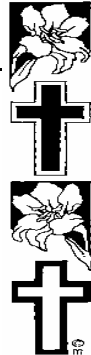

Ushers

Ushers play a critical role in the parish. They are ministers of hospitality, and work to ensure that everyone has a pleasant experience as they come and go from the church, and that they are able to do so safely. Ushers are always on the lookout for people who need assistance or information. They take up the collections each week, but also do much more. They help people find seats as they enter for Mass. Ushers see to the needs of the parishioners, assisting in the seating for elderly, and disabled. Ushering is a challenging ministry, but so rewarding! Altar Servers

These are parishioners who assist the priest in various ways during Mass. Any parishioner, child or adult, who has received the sacrament of first Holy Communion is eligible to serve on the altar. Altar servers are required to be at church at least 15 minutes before Mass begins, in order to put on the vestments and receive any special instructions from the priest as needed. Training is required for this ministry, and is scheduled periodically throughout the year. Those who serve at the altar set the example of prayerfulness and reverence for the rest of the congregation. To receive training as an altar server, contact ext. 21 at the church office.



Lectors

Lectors proclaim the word of God each week. This is one ministry that does require *special gifts*: a *strong and animated voice, clear speech, and the commitment to prepare the readings with great care*. This is a critical ministry. If the congregation does not hear the Word of God clearly when the Lectors proclaim it, they will not hear it at all that week. A Lector must be a confirmed Catholic, registered in the parish, and receive training for this ministry. Training for this ministry is an ongoing process, and all lectors are expected to constantly strive for improvement. Contact Ext 21 at the church office.

Evangelization

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

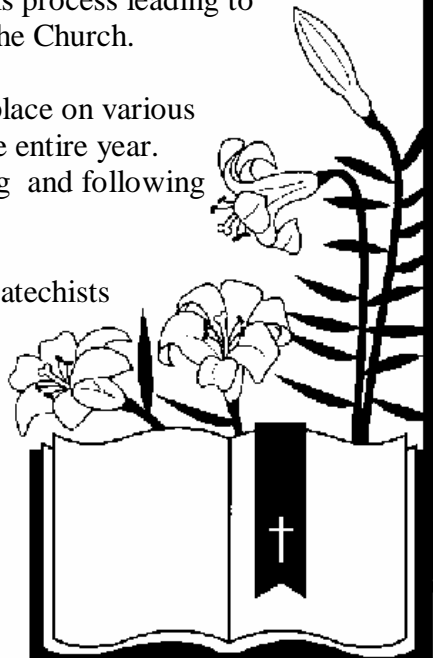
This is the process for the initiation of adults and children of catechetical age (over 7 yrs.) and the reception of baptized candidates into the Catholic church.


Instruction, spiritual formation, discernment, and rituals that celebrate the various stages of conversion are all part of this process leading to sacramental reception into the Church.

For adults phase one takes place on various Monday evenings during the entire year. Phase two takes place during and following the 9:30 Mass on Sundays.

We always need sponsors, catechists and special events helpers.



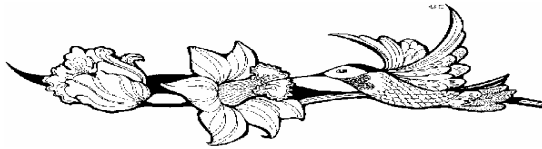

Collection Counter Teams

For obvious reasons, this ministry is by invitation only. If you have good skills at counting money, are a very reliable person, and have time during weekday mornings to devote to this important ministry, contact the church office at Ext. 11, and inquire about being assigned to a team. Each team works once every six weeks.

Mailing Teams

The parish mailing team is assembled as needed. Mailings are usually done on weekday mornings after the 9:00 AM Mass. The team prepares special parish mailings by stuffing and sealing envelopes, attaching address labels, and zip code sorting. Anyone who is interested in this ministry should contact the church office, ext. 14



Bulletin Preparation Teams

The Bulletin preparation team meets every Friday morning after the 9:00 AM Mass. They put all weekly inserts into the church bulletin, and take finished bulletins to the church for distribution at all Masses. Anyone who would like to be part of this team can simply come to the church office after the 9:00AM Mass any Friday and join the crew.



Ministry Coordinator

This new ministry provides an opportunity to those who have a gift for organization and delegation. A ministry coordinator is in charge of recruiting, training and scheduling lay ministers for one specific ministry. For example, the usher coordinator is in charge of stewarding the usher ministry by encouraging new ministers to join, by conducting occasional training sessions, and by scheduling ministers so that the needs of each Mass are met. Ministry Coordinators work closely with Mass Coordinators, the Director of Stewardship, and the Pastor. If this sounds like your niche, Contact Tom at ext. 21.

Finance Council

This group of business oriented parishioners assists the Pastor in his role as steward of the parish finances. This council sets the budget for the parish, establishes goals for growth, and provides financial accountability. The group meets quarterly, with extra meetings scheduled as needed during the third and fourth quarter, to design the coming year's budget. Members on this council are appointed, based upon experience in a finance related field. If you are interested in being considered, you may present a summary of your qualifications to the Pastor, through the Parish Secretary.

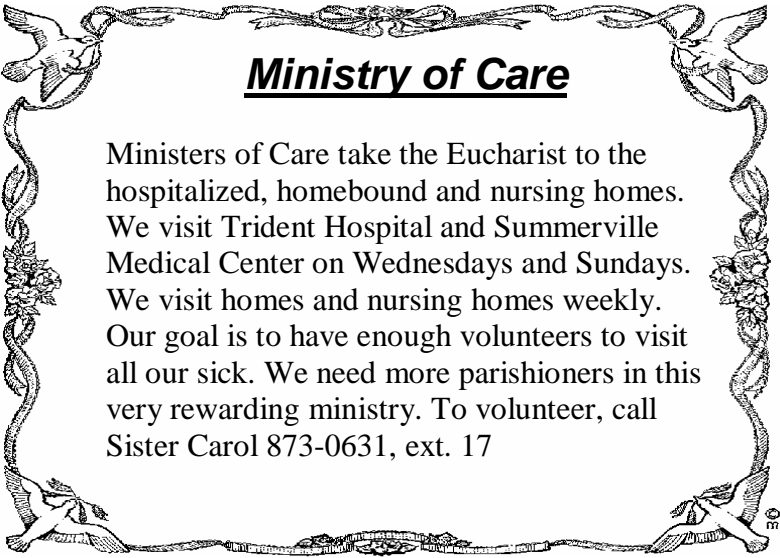
Parish Event Team

Prison Ministry

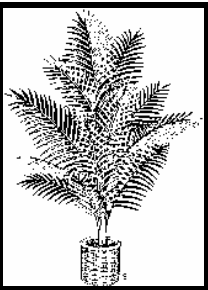

The mission of St. John the Beloved Youth Ministry is to empower youth to live as disciples of Jesus Christ, to lead youth into a full participation in the Catholic faith community, and to foster real, personal growth in a relationship with Jesus Christ. St. John the Beloved Youth Ministry is composed of several components as described in the National Conference of Catholic Bishops' document *Renewing the Vision: A Framework for Catholic Youth Ministry*. These are advocacy, catechesis, community life, evangelization, justice and service, leadership development, pastoral care, and prayer and worship. Youth Ministry at St. John the Beloved encompasses Jr. High Youth Group, which is religious formation for sixth-eighth grade, the High School Youth Group, which is religious formation for ninth-twelfth grade, and confirmation preparation, done in conjunction with the Office of Religious Education. Special events of these programs include regular service projects, parish teen retreats for the junior high and high school, a high school ski trip, a junior high rafting trip, and participation in annual diocesan conferences and events. 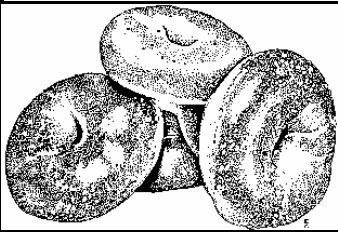
Spanish Ministry

Minister of Hospitality

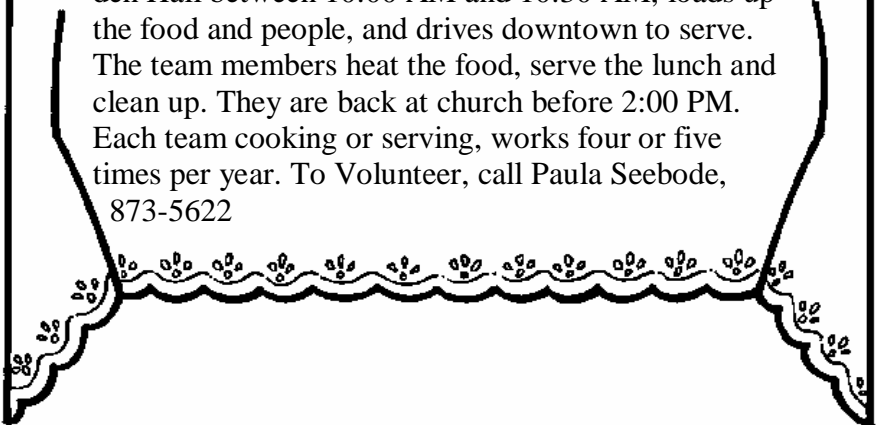

Outreach for the Hungry

The dedicated members of Outreach for the Hungry make and serve lunch for the hungry people at Neighborhood House, a soup kitchen in the basement of Our Lady of Mercy church on America Street in Charleston. We cook and serve once per month. We use the food donated by parishioners on the second Sunday of each month. There are four cooking teams. Each cooking team meets in the Madden Hall kitchen on Sunday mornings. The team makes one of four recipes for soup or hearty casseroles; enough for 300 servings. They also cook an extra pot for Palmetto House, Summerville's homeless shelter. The serving teams are scheduled on either Mondays or Tuesdays. A serving team meets at Madden Hall between 10:00 AM and 10:30 AM, loads up the food and people, and drives downtown to serve. The team members heat the food, serve the lunch and clean up. 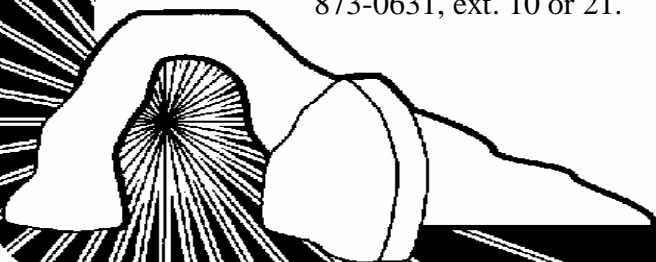


Senior Exercise Group

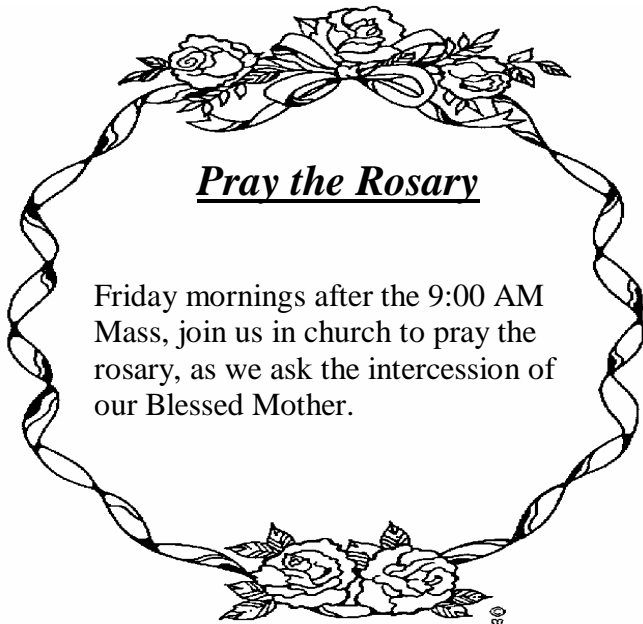
Christian Formation

Kairos Prison Ministry

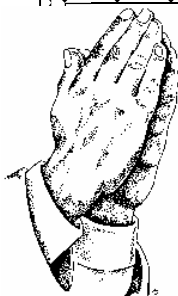

Men's Prayer and Reflection

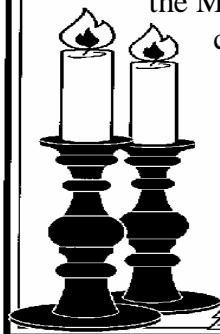

Women's Club

This ministry is a parish community composed of women of all ages. Our purpose is to focus on four areas: spiritual development, service in the parish and community, social ministry, and ecumenical understanding. A few of our activities include: Basket Bingo fundraiser and family fun, womens' retreat to Mepkin Abbey, preparing and delivering Christmas bags to local nursing homes, womens' health awareness, and food preparation for parish events. Music Ministry

Adult Choir—There are two adult choirs, both of which are open to parishioners high school-age and older. They sing for Sunday liturgies, Holy Day liturgies, and special programs, September through mid-June. The larger group rehearses on Wednesday evenings from 7 pm to 9 pm, with other seasonal rehearsals scheduled on an as-needed basis. The smaller group has no mid-week rehearsal, but rather prepares music on their own with the help of a weekly e-mail that contains a list of music and practice files that can be listened to on a computer. Both groups are essentially “traditional,” though they sing music from a wide range of styles, including contemporary and gospel.



Childrens Choir

A children's choir is formed once a year to sing for the 4 pm Christmas Eve liturgy. This group forms in early November, and rehearses until the week before Christmas. Children must be able to carry a tune, match pitch, and read (words, not music...but music-reading ability would be highly valued!) If there is sufficient interest, it would be wonderful if we could start a children's choir that rehearses regularly.

Resurrection Choir

To assist the bereaved in their time of sorrow, a choir assembles to sing at funeral liturgies. All singers in the parish (even those that aren't members of one of the other groups) as well as guests from other parishes who are available to sing at the time of the funeral (typically 9am on weekdays) are welcome. Rehearsals are held 30 minutes prior to the liturgy.


Cantor Ministry

Cantors lead us in the prayer of music, just as lectors lead us in the prayer of the spoken Word. The cantor's role includes singing the Responsorial Psalm and Gospel Acclamation as well as leading the assembly in all of the sung prayers and hymns of the Mass. Cantors usually come from within one of the adult choirs, but exceptions could be made for the right candidate.




Handbells

The parish is fortunate to have a 5-octave set of handbells. These bells are used to add festivity or austerity to choral music. The parish has had handbell ensembles in the past, though at present there is not one. As with the children's choir, if there is enough interest, it would be possible to start one again.
